CITY COUNCIL APPROVES ENTERPRISE BRIDGE STUDY



The West Sacramento City Council has approved a contract for a comprehensive study of the Enterprise Bridge project.

The proposed bridge would directly connect the Southport

Industrial Park to Interstate 80, relieving traffic congestion from Southport Parkway and Industrial Blvd. It would also serve as a convenient connection between the north and south parts of town providing a route during emergencies.

This initiative will improve safety for all road users and increase accessibility for pedestrians and cyclists. The study will explore various options to address environmental concerns and improved design, aligning with the city's sustainability goals in reducing greenhouse gas emissions and advancements in environmental equity.

THE WEST SAC GOATS RETURN FOR SPRING GRAZING
